## **LEARNING AND PROGRESS**

## The countdown to the summer examination season is almost at zero!

As we knew would happen, all too quickly we have now arrived at the start of the examination season! Many practical exams have taken place and written examinations start on Wednesday 8 May. To prepare students for this we have:

- Provided study support material and revision guides
- Issued an Alternative Timetable for Year 11, information for which is <u>available on our website</u>

Please help us to help your child be successful throughout this exam season by:

- Providing positive and encouraging support over the coming weeks.
- Ensuring that they attend all of the revision sessions: these are compulsory!
- Making sure they arrive for the right exams at the right time. Text reminders about exams will be sent to parents and carers the day before. Briefing sessions will run for GCSE exams 30 minutes before the start times and we would expect all students to attend these.
- Making sure they are dressed in full school uniform / according to the Sixth Form dress code.
- Making sure that they bring water to drink in a clear plastic bottle.
- Making sure they have all the correct equipment: a calculator (we recommend a Casio FX83 calculator), a clear ruler, a compass and protractor for Maths exams. They are putting themselves at a disadvantage should they not have this equipment. Should you need any financial support with the purchase of equipment, please contact Ms Pankhania, Assistant Principal: jpankhania@latimer.org.uk.
- Make sure they are eating and drinking at regular intervals.
- Reassure them reinforce that you are and will be proud of them, no matter what happens.

## Please remember that students are not allowed any potential technological or web enabled devices, such as mobile phones or smart watches in any examination venues.

We request that students leave these at home on exam days along with their mobile phones. If they need to bring them in to school, they must be turned off/removed before the exam, and placed in their bag. Any breaches of this will be reported to the relevant exam board and it is inevitable that disqualification will be a consequence.

## Ace Your Exams: A Trial Run for Years 10 and 12

We are in the process of finalising the timetables for Year 10 and Year 12 mock exams, which will take place in mid-June. Full details will come out shortly to parents and carers and students will be given a timetable. However, they do not need to wait for the timetable to start revision and should be speaking to staff about the best way to do this now.

## **YEAR 12**

## Managing your time and workload

Year 12 students have been informed about the increased workload expected over the next two terms as we prepare for University Applications, Personal Statements, Work Experience and Mock Exams. Alongside their regular lessons and homework, it is crucial for students to develop strong time management skills and prioritise effectively. To support them in this, students have been introduced to the Eisenhower Matrix, a tool that can greatly aid in self-organisation. More details about how to use this tool can be found <u>here</u>.

## **University Applications and Personal Statements**

As a school, we encourage all our students to complete a University Application. This offers them valuable experience in navigating complex online application forms and prepares them for future application processes, where attention to detail and error-checking are crucial. While we understand that not all students may wish to pursue university education and may opt for alternative pathways, sending off their applications is entirely optional. Alongside the University Application, students will also be required to create a Personal Statement. Year 12 students will focus on drafting their Personal Statements throughout terms 5 and 6.

## **Work Experience Week**

As part of our raising aspirations programme, we ask all Year 12 students to undertake a careers based work placement designed to develop their employability skills, increase their appreciation of the commercial world and inspire future career choices. We cannot express how valuable work experience is and are encouraging our students to find a minimum of 5 days (which may be spread across more than one placement) from 15 to 19 July. During this period, there will be no classes, as students will be at the workplace of their host employer.

We are aware that many employers now adopt remote working and, therefore, finding a placement may be challenging and that your child may need your help. For this reason, we would very much welcome your input in guiding and supporting them through this process. Students (and their families) should source their own work experience placements. The careers guidance and sixth form team will do their best to find placements for any students who have been unable to find their own, but because we have limited resources, we expect only to be able to help a few students. If students are unable to secure a suitable work placement, they are required to inform Ms Magee, Sixth Form Centre Manager, as soon as possible.


## Year 13

Over the Easter Holidays, our first international trip since the pandemic took place, 31 students from Years 12 and 13 visited Berlin and explored many of the key sites the city has to offer. Although the weather on the first day took us by surprise (26 degrees!), students got to complete a walking tour of Berlin finished by a trip up the Reichstag Dome.

Over the remainder of the trip we visited Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp, Checkpoint Charlie, the TV Tower and the memorial to the murdered Jews of Europe as well as a second walking tour that focused on communist and socialist Berlin.



The students were a credit to the school while away and were a pleasure to spend 4 days with.
